

2021 Hancock Prospecting WA Swimming Championships – Event Changes

With the 2021 Hancock Prospecting WA Swimming Championships approaching quickly, Swimming WA is working hard to create a fantastic event for all. We would like to inform you of some changes to the event schedule that will be different from years past but will create a better event.

Entry / Exit Procedure -

As has occurred over the previous years, Swimmers will enter the competition arena through the archway nearest the marshalling yard. Swimmers will then compete in their final and exit the pool via the stairs closest to their lane. This year Swimmers will be asked to head directly toward their clothes which would have been collected by the basket carriers and taken to the grandstand side of the pool.

After each final medalists will be asked to head straight to the medal presentation area, whereas all other swimmers will be free to cool down or speak to their coach.

State Medals -

Similar to National Age Championships, this year Swimming WA will be altering our medal presentation procedure to create a faster paced medal presentation procedure to minimize the impact on the athlete post-race whilst maintaining the integrity of a State Medal.

At the conclusion of each final, the medalists will be walked from the competition pool to the medal presentation area. Medals will be presented at the conclusion of the next event, i.e. Race 1, Race 2, Medals 1, Race 3, Medals 2 etc. As per usual, club shirts, pants (or the bottom half of the race suit) and shoes are required at medal presentations.

If you are unable to attend the medal presentation at the dedicated time, you will be required to retrieve your medal from the volunteers assisting.

Open State Championship Medals -

Given the changes to the event programme, all age groups will swim events at separate times to create a more entertaining event. Swimming WA still wish to recognize the Open State Champion in each event and therefore will present the Open State Champion to the fastest swimmer no matter the age once all age groups have completed the event.

i.e. Friday – Boys 14-15 100m Freestyle, Saturday – Boys 16-17 100m Freestyle & Sunday Men's 18 & Over 100m Freestyle. State Open Champion to be crowned Sunday evening.

State Championship Trophies -

With the recent changes to the Swimmer of the Year Awards Night, Swimming WA wish to recognize the achievements of all athletes who win perpetual trophies. This year the PB Award will be presented to the swimmer who does the biggest PB based on percentage throughout each heat session. You cannot win the award twice.
